Thank you for your interest in applying for an apartment at Covenant Manor. Covenant Manor provides housing for households whose Head of Household, Spouse or Co-Head is 62 years of age or older, or is a disabled person age 18 or older, at the time of application. Additionally, the total annual income of the household must fall under the maximum income limit for the community, as determined by HUD and as administered by the Low Income Housing Tax Credit Program. All information requested in the application packet must be completed. Incomplete applications will not be considered. If the information requested does not apply to you, please indicate by using "N/A" for not applicable. This will tell us that you understand the requested information and you did not intentionally leave it blank. If you make a mistake or typo, please draw a single line through the error(s) and initial the change(s). Please do not use whiteout to correct the errors.

Covenant Manor is proud to join our community's efforts to increase housing available for persons exiting homelessness by participating in the "Opening Doors Through Multifamily Housing" initiative. To support these efforts, we have adopted a preference for certain homeless persons or families and want to make you aware of that preference:

- At least one member of the household who is 62 years or older must meet one of the following qualifying requirements:

If you don't respond to us whether or not you still want your name to remain on the waiting list, you will be removed from our waiting list.

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The apartments are offered as they become available. As your name reaches the top of the waiting list, you will be required to come in for an interview. At that time, you will be asked to sign the authorization forms which allows our staff to further verify your age, income, assets, allowances, criminal history, sex offender status, credit history and landlord references.

Section 214 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1980, as amended, prohibits the Secretary of HUD from making financial assistance available to persons other than United States citizens, nationals, or certain categories of eligible non-citizens in the following HUD programs:

- a. Public and Indian Housing Programs
- b. Section 8 Housing Assistance Payments Programs
- c. Section 235 of the National Housing Act

You have applied, or are applying for assistance under one of these programs; therefore, you are required to declare

This Section 214 review will be completed in conjunction with the verification of other aspects of eligibility for assistance. If you have any questions or difficulty in completing the attached formats or determining the type of documentation required, please contact the Administrator at **(415) 931-4496**. Also, if you are unable to provide the required documentation, you should immediately contact this office and request an extension, using the block provided on the Declaration Format. Failure to provide this information or establish eligible status may result in your not being considered for housing assistance.

If this Section 214 review results in a determination of ineligibility, you will have an opportunity to appeal the decision. Also, if the final determination concludes that only certain members of your family are eligible for assistance, your family may be eligible for proration of assistance. That means that when assistance is available, a reduced amount may be provided for your family, based on the number of members who are eligible.

If assistance becomes available and the other aspects of your eligibility review show that you are eligible for housing assistance, it may be provided to you prior to the final determination of this Section 214 review, depending on how far the review has progressed and the information that is available at that point. You will be contacted as soon as we have further information regarding your eligibility for assistance.

THINK ABOUT THIS... IS FRAUD WORTH IT?

Do You Realize...

If you commit fraud to obtain assisted housing from HUD, you could be:

- Evicted from your apartment or house.
- Required to repay all overpaid rental assistance you received.
- **Fined** up to \$10,000.
- Imprisoned for up to five years.
- Prohibited from receiving future assistance.
- Subject to State and local government penalties.

Do You Know...

You are committing fraud if you sign a form knowing that you provided false or misleading information.

The information you provide on housing assistance application and recertification forms will be checked. The local housing agency, HUD, or the Office of Inspector General will check the income and asset information you provide with other Federal, State, or local governments and with private agencies. Certifying false information is fraud.

So Be Careful!

When you fill out your application and yearly recertification for assisted housing from HUD make sure your answers to the questions are accurate and honest. You <u>must</u> include:

All sources of income and changes in income you or any members of your household receive, such as wages, welfare payments, social security and veterans' benefits, pensions, retirement, etc.

Any money you receive on behalf of your children, such as child support, AFDC payments, social security for children, etc.

Any increase in income, such as wages from a new job or an expected pay raise or bonus.

All assets, such as bank accounts, savings bonds, certificates of deposit, stocks, real estate, etc., that are owned by you or any member of your household.

All income from assets, such as interest from savings and checking accounts, stock dividends, etc.

Any business or asset (your home) that you sold in the last two years at less than full value.

The names of everyone, adults or children, relatives and non-relatives, who are living with you and make up your household.

(Important Notice for Hurricane Katrina and Hurricane Rita Evacuees: HUD's reporting requirements may be temporarily waived or suspended because of your circumstances. Contact the local housing agency before you complete the housing assistance application.)

Ask Questions

If you don't understand something on the application or recertification forms, always ask questions. It's better to be safe than sorry.

Watch Out for Housing Assistance Scams!


- Don't pay money to have someone fill out housing assistance application and recertification forms for you.
- Don't pay money to move up on a waiting list.
- Don't pay for anything that is not covered by your lease.
- Get a receipt for any money you pay.
- Get a written explanation if you are required to pay for anything other than rent (maintenance or utility charges).

Report Fraud

If you know of anyone who provided false information on a HUD housing assistance application or recertification or if anyone tells you to provide false information, report that person to the HUD Office of Inspector General Hotline.
