Once the application is received, it will be determined whether you preliminarily qualify to be placed on the waiting list. If you do not qualify, you will be notified in writing. Please remember to notify us, via your preferred method of contact, if your information changes (contact information, income information, etc.). We update our waiting list once per year. If you do not respond to us whether or not you still want your name to remain on the waiting list, you will be removed from our waiting list.

The apartments are offered as they become available. As your name reaches the top of the waiting list, you will be required to come in for an interview. At that time, you will be asked to sign the authorization forms which allows our staff to further verify your age, income, assets, allowances, criminal history, sex offender status, credit history and landlord references.

A screening will be completed for all applicants to verify rental addresses, criminal, sex offender, eviction and any balance owed from previous landlord. 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Resident Selection Criteria

All applicants for housing will be screened according to the criteria set forth on the Resident Selection Plan. Management will run a criminal background check, register sex offender report on all applicants and it will check court records for evictions or judgements against the applicant. The purpose of these checks is to obtain information on the applicant's past history of meeting financial obligations and future ability to make timely rent payments and to determine if the applicant is eligible to live at this apartment.

Households may be ineligible for occupancy for various reasons including, but not limited to, the following:

- a) The applicant/household does not meet the program/community eligibility requirements;
- b) The household gross income is over the applicable income limit published by HUD and/or LIHTC program;
- c) The applicant/household's monthly income does not meet the minimum income standard established for this community for non-subsided apartments;
- d) The applicant/household contains a student enrolled in an Institute of Higher Education who does not meet the exemption criteria per program requirements;
- e) There is submission of false or untrue information on the application;
- f) Failure to cooperate in the verification process including failure to provide requested information;
- g) Failure to schedule and/or attend interviews;
- h) The applicant/household has refused two offered apartments and does not have a valid medical reason;
- i) The applicant/household has an unacceptable criminal background as reported by a consumer-reporting agency;
- j) Household size does not conform to the stated minimum and maximum occupancy sizes;
- k) Failure to sign designated or required forms and/or documents upon request;
- l) Failure to disclose and document Social Security numbers on all non-exempt household members within 90 days of the date the household was first offered an apartment;
- m) This will not be the only residence for the applicant/household;
- n) The applicant/household is not willing to pay the rent as calculated under the subsidy program.
- o) Failure to present all applicants during the interview with the Community Administrator;
- p) Blatant disrespect or disruptive behavior, or demonstrable history of such behavior, towards management, the property, or other residents exhibited by an applicant or household member or friend any time prior to move-in;
- q) Misrepresentation of any information related to eligibility, allowance, household composition or rent.
- r) Other cause, including, but not limited to, failure to meet any of the selection criteria in this document.
- s) Current and prior landlords will be contacted to determine rent paying history, disturbance of neighbors, destruction of property or housekeeping habits which would pose a threat to other residents;
- t) A negative landlord reference from a former landlord; Unpaid balance due a prior landlord;
- u) A household member convicted of drug-related criminal activity for manufacture or production of methamphetamine on the premises of federally assisted housing will not be approved for residency;

- v) A household member currently engaged in use of a drug or if the owner has reasonable cause to believe that a household member's illegal use of a drug or pattern of illegal use may interfere with the health, safety, or right to peaceful enjoyment of the premises by other residents will not be approved for residency;
- w) A household member who is subject to lifetime registration requirement under a State Sex Offender Registration Program will not be admitted under any circumstances.
- x) A household member's abuse or pattern of abuse of alcohol that interferes with the health, safety, or peaceful enjoyment of the premises by other residents;

While other qualifications may apply, the above-mentioned have been established to reflect a short version of the Resident Selection Plan.

Application Decision:

If the application is approved and the applicant accepts an available apartment offered, the applicant will be asked to schedule a time to come and sign the lease. All household members must attend this session. During this meeting, the applicant will be required to sign a lease agreement in which they will agree to abide by all the rules and regulations. We will also conduct a unit inspection with the applicant. The applicant is encouraged to read all leasing documents in advance of this appointment. Upon request, they will be mailed to the applicant. If the application is denied, the applicant will be notified of this decision in writing. This written statement will include the reason(s) for the denial, and state that the applicant has the right to request an appeal for this denial decision and present any extenuating circumstances the applicant would like to have considered.

Appeal Procedure:

Applicants have fourteen [14] days after the date of denial letter to notify management in writing or request a meeting if they would like to appeal the denial decision. If a denial letter is sent to an applicant, and no response or new evidence is received within fourteen [14] days, the file will be closed permanently. If the applicant submits a written notice of appeal or requests an appeal meeting within fourteen days after the date of the denial letter, a management representative who was not a party to the original decision to deny will handle the appeal. This representative will review the application and any new facts or information that the applicant feels would have an effect on their application. Management will notify the applicant of their final decision within five (5) business days of receiving the applicant's written appeal or the date of the appeal meeting. People with disabilities have the right to request reasonable accommodation to participate in the appeal process. Available units will not be held open during the appeal procedure. If a unit is not available at the completion of the appeal procedure and the appeal is granted, the applicant will be put back on the Waiting List in its original position. A complete Grievance Procedure and Policy is available for anyone who wishes to file a grievance and/or requires detailed information about this subject. This policy is included with the denial letter. The applicant has the right to dispute the accuracy of any information provided to property by the Consumer Reporting Agency or Screening Company. If the application is denied due to unfavorable information received during the screening process the applicant may contact the Consumer Reporting Agency that provides the information to the Property. The contact information will be contained in the denial letter. The applicant also has the right to obtain a free copy of the consumer report from the consumer reporting agency that provided the information if the applicant requests it within 60 days of application denial.
